Human Values and the 3 H's

Just as birth is instinctive and that all women are born with the knowledge about how to give birth, so we can also trust that being heartcentered during parenting, postpartum doula work, and life in general, will always help us make the right decisions in any circumstance. The best way to put this into practice is through the 3 H's which you can also teach to your new parents. In the first weeks at home with a new baby, the mother is recovering from birth, and also getting to know her baby. It is a time filled with uncertainty.



The 3 H's stand for Head, Heart, and Hands. This means that whenever a thought comes and a decision needs to be made, remember to take it first to your heart and only then to your hands where action will be carried out. This way all your actions, instead of coming straight from the subconscious, will be governed by love generated through the heart and we can trust that these decisions will always be right for any given moment in time. The end result of this practice is more calm and connection, better sleep, and improved health.

The Practice of Human Values

The practice of human values allows us to provide our clients with the type of support they deserve as they navigate life with a new baby or babies. When we practice human values during the postpartum period we facilitate a safe space for learning, healing and growing. In this safe space, families are able to explore their parenting options, bond, and build confidence in their new roles. The practice of human values also ensures a high standard of care for the new babies.
